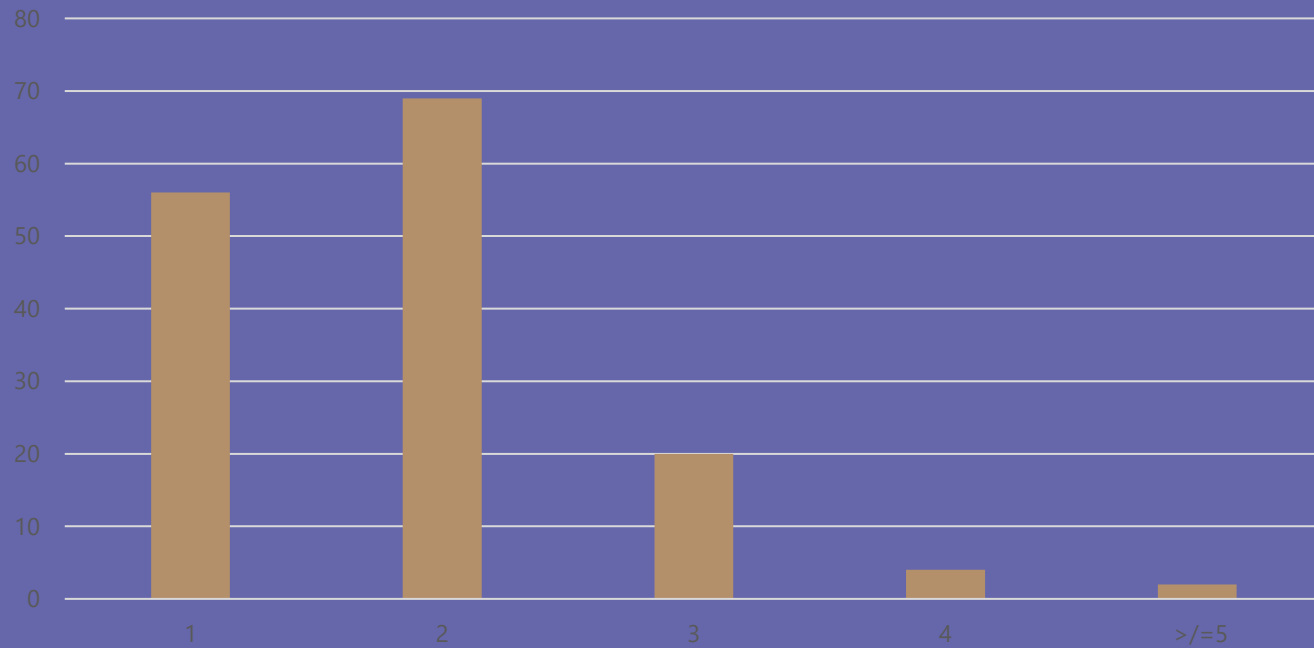

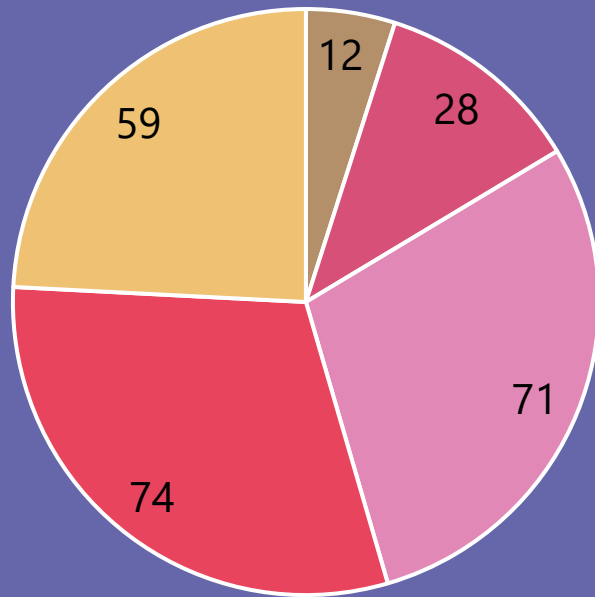

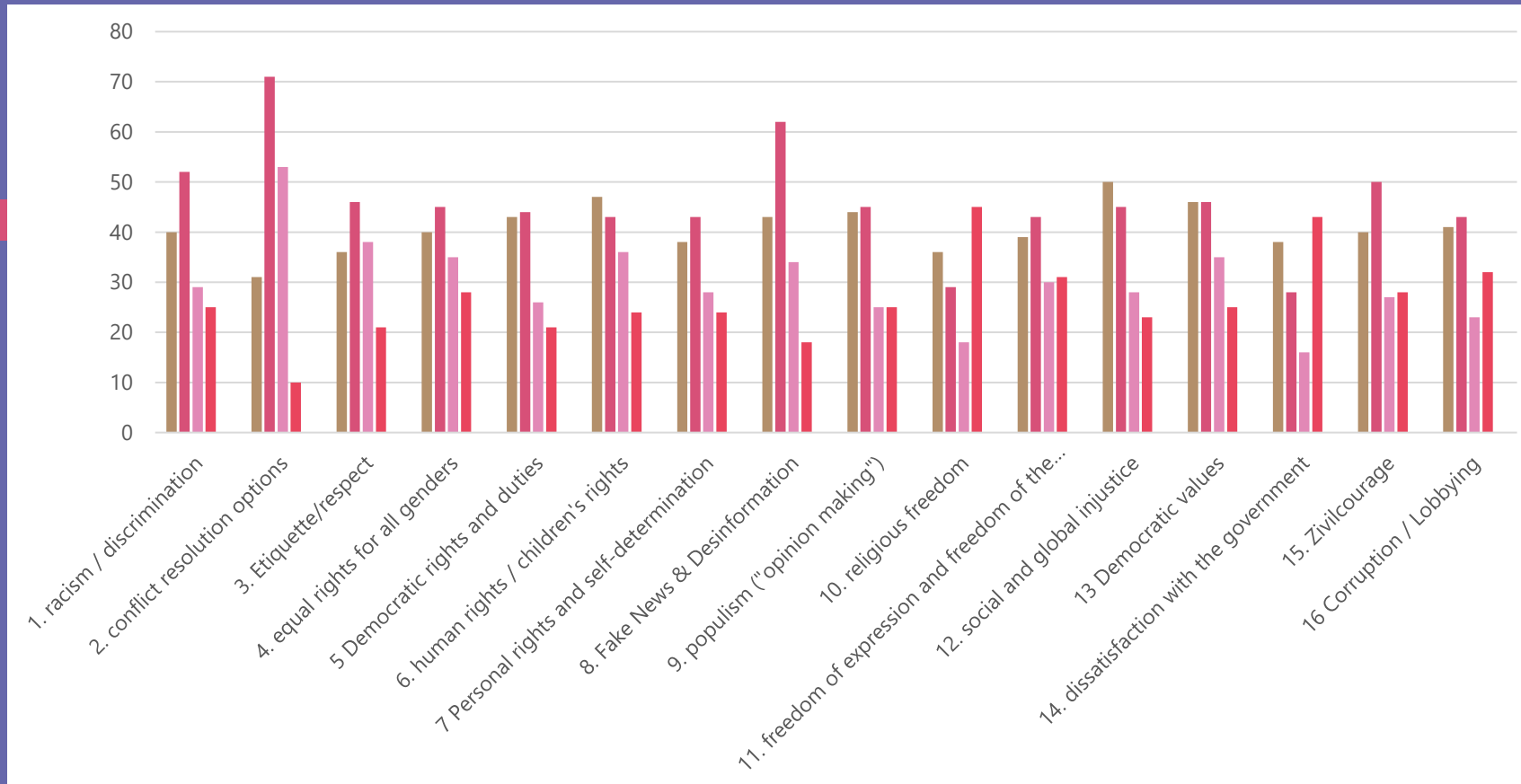


AGE DISTRIBUTION

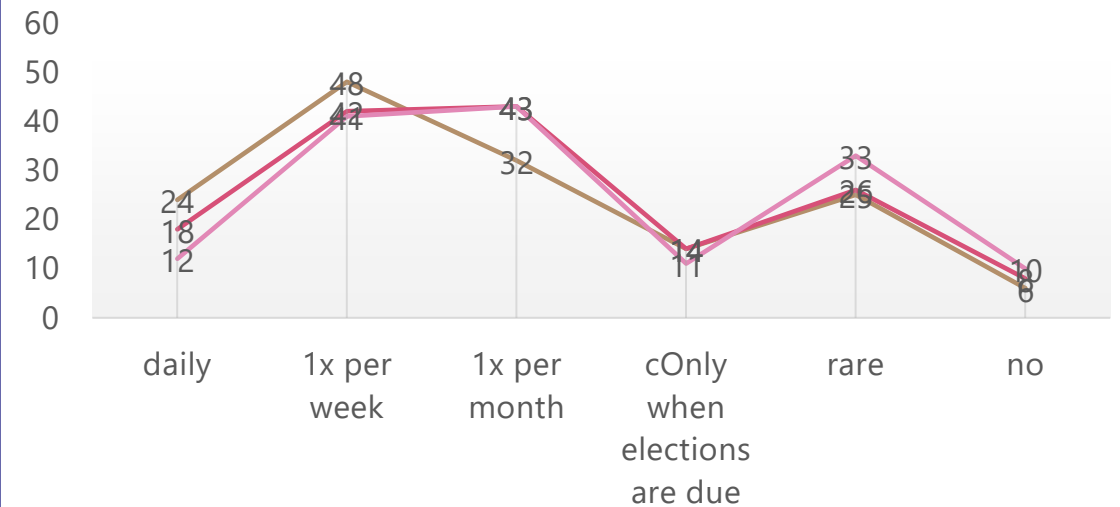

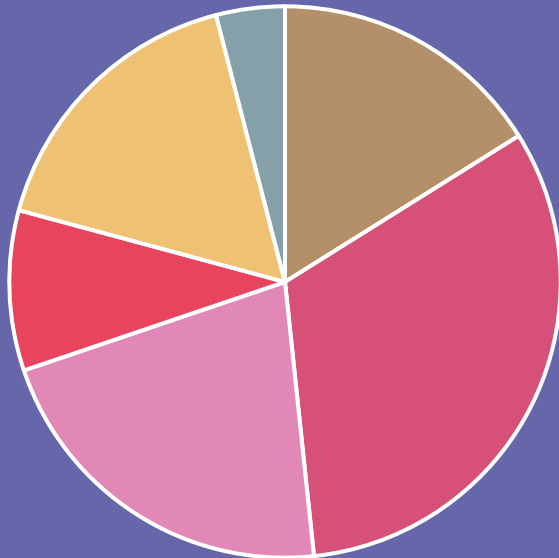

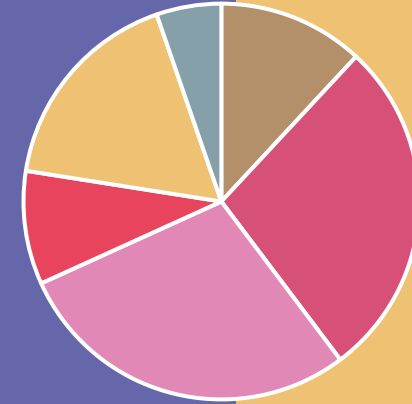

Do the adults in the family talk to each other about democracy, and if so, how often?



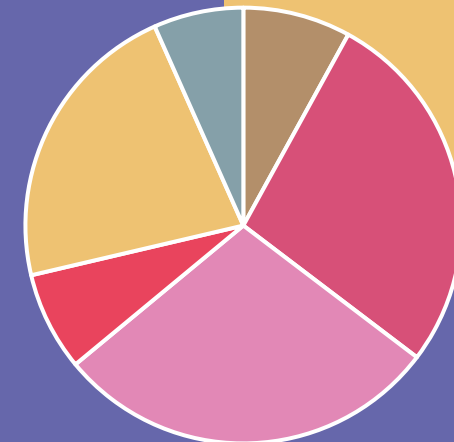
